

# It's Kickoff For Ivies

Cornell and all the other Ivy League footballers will get going today. Cornell tackles Colgate at Schoellkopf at 1:30 p.m.

All of the others also will be in non-leaguers. They'll have two weeks of this, then they'll start the annual round robin leading toward the title in late November.

The Big Red, which has shared one title in the 18 years of the circuit, doesn't figure to win this one, although it is generally conceded that it's a wide open race. But it is favored to win a sixth straight in the Colgate series even though this will be its baptism while it will be Game No. 2 for the Raiders. Not only that, and "that" was a 16-0 decision over The Citadel, but Colgate had an earlier testing in a scrimmage with Penn.

Cornell, for the first time in years, didn't have an outside scrimmage. But Coach George Seifert, starting out on the chore, feels that much has been accomplished as he has gotten to know his fellows well over the past four weeks.

Joe Mollica, a junior, who saw only sparse action last Fall, will direct the wing-T attack. For the most part Mollica will have upperclassmen at his beck and call, although there is a fair sprinkling of sophomores. In fact two will be in the backfield, Neal Hall at tailback and Dave Tretter at wing. Don Fanelli will go at fullback, although he also can play at tailback.

Two key sophomore starters on defense are Terry Lee, a linebacker, and Scy Young, halfback. Lee was an outstanding tight end as a freshman but has really blossomed as a backer.

Colgate runs out of the wishbone and has an experience quarterback in Bruce Basile and excellent runners in Pat Healy and Henry White.

Both teams have excellent kickers. Jerry Andrewlavage kicked three field goals in the victory over Citadel. Cornell has the veter Bernie Szynalski.

Harvard starts out against Holy Cross today, Columbia faces Lafayette, Princeton meets always-tough Rutgers, Yale plays Connecticut, Dartmouth goes against Massachusetts, Brown plays Rhode Island and Pennsylvania clashes with Lehigh.

A turnout of 14,000 is expected to view the action on the Poly-Turf. It is the fifth year that Cornell has the artificial surface, which seems all the more helpful when weather is inclement.

It also is the Red's 60th season at Schoellkopf, since departing old Percy Field.
